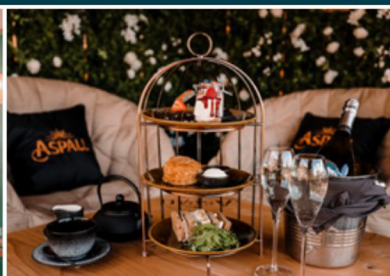
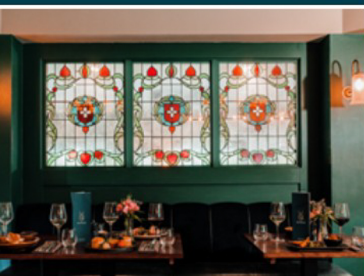

### GRINDLEFORD HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY ANNUAL SHOW RULES

1. Entries: the entry fee varies depending on the number of exhibits entered. 1-5 entries = £1, 6-10 entries = £2, 11-20 entries £3.00, over 20 entries £4. Children's entries are free. Non-Patrons pay an additional fee of £1 p/person.
2. **Each exhibitor must complete a separate entry form.** Entries will be accepted on Thursday, 20<sup>th</sup> August at the Bishop Pavilion between 6.00 pm. & 8.30 pm. **No late entries can be accepted.**
3. Staging of exhibits: staging is from 8.00 am on the day of the Show and must be completed by 9.45 am. No exhibits or cards may be removed before the presentation of trophies (4pm).
4. **Exhibitor's efforts to improve the impact of their displays are welcome but please do not overly expand the display footprint. If display space becomes crowded, the stewards may have to reset an exhibitors display to reduce space used and ensure an equitable allocation of space for all entries.**
5. For classes 1 – 98 all exhibits must be the property of the exhibitors. All horticultural exhibits must have been grown in the exhibitor's own garden or allotment. The name of variety is to be shown where possible.
6. Multiple Exhibits: exhibitors can enter multiple exhibits in a class but can only win one prize. Two or more persons may not compete separately in the same class with produce from the same garden or allotment.
7. Art & Craft: entries in the Art & Craft section must not have been exhibited previously at Grindleford Show.
8. The Committee reserves the right to decide on any matter not covered by these rules.

#### **Notes for Judges**

1. Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) rules will be applied by the judges for all flower and vegetable classes.
2. Judges may not award a prize to entries of insufficient merit.
3. Judges may handle exhibits, open pods etc. to check for quality.
4. Judges should use their discretion when judging the Tray class remembering that entries may not come from regular exhibitors.
5. Points awarded should be marked by the judges on the exhibitor's scorecard.
6. Comments written by judges are always welcomed by exhibitors.

## Information for Exhibitors

1. Classes – most classes in the show are 'open': we welcome exhibitors from outside Grindleford. Some classes and trophies are for residents and allotment holders in Grindleford parish only.
2. A novice exhibitor is someone who has not previously exhibited in the applicable section (e.g. Domestic/Floral Art) at the Grindleford Show.
3. Any queries, regarding anything other than the above rules, should be decided by the show officials. Show stewards are available for each section.
4. Failure to abide by any of the show rules will lead to disqualification.
5. Presentation of trophies will take place at 4.00pm with prize money to be collected upon announcement.
6. Prize money for each class will be 1<sup>st</sup> £1.50, 2<sup>nd</sup> £1, 3<sup>rd</sup> 50p\*
  - \*Except in classes where prize money is listed in the schedule.
  - Prize money not collected on the day of the Show will be treated as a donation to the GHS
7. Raffle & Auction: Raffle prizes will be available to collect at 4.15pm followed by an auction of donated and unclaimed exhibits.

## How to exhibit

Complete the attached entry form for each class you wish to enter. **A separate form is required for each exhibitor.** Extra forms are available from the Community Shop or on registration night at the Bishop Pavilion.

1. When entering the Art & Craft section, the dimensions of your exhibit are needed so that a suitable place can be allocated.
2. **For classes 130 - 136, please bring your work to registration. We will allocate an entry number for you. Please do not write your name on your work. Poems and prose, haiku and limericks should be presented in an envelope with the class number written on the back.**
3. Take your form, together with the appropriate fee, to: Bishop Pavilion – 6.00pm to 8.30pm on Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> August.

## Important Notes:

1. **You may stage your exhibit(s) from 8.00am until 9.45 am on Show Day.**
2. **Use the tables provided at the marquee entrance to prepare your exhibit.**
3. **Check to make sure your exhibit conforms to the class details and both the exhibit and display (e.g. black board) fits within the space allocated. (See point 4 of the rules).**
4. **Judging begins at 10.00am prompt.**
5. **Exhibits must not be removed before 4pm.**

## ROYAL BANKSIAN MEDAL

This medal has been granted to the Society by the Royal Horticultural Society,

**'To be awarded to the winner of the highest number of points in the whole of the Horticultural classes in the show.'**

In horticultural classes each exhibitor shall score 3 points for first place, 2 for second place and 1 for third.

Any exhibitor who has won the Banksian Medal at the Grindleford Show in the last two years is not eligible to win this medal.

Should two exhibitors obtain equal scores then the award should go to the one who has taken the greater number of first prizes unless he/she has previously won a Banksian medal and the other has not.

3. **Marks awarded:** Each class of flowers and vegetable(s) will be marked out of 20 giving a total of 40 points.

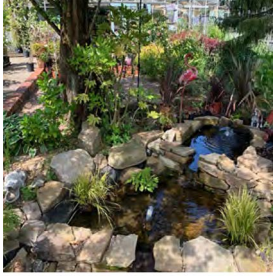

**Rules**

1. The Tray class is a collection of 3 types of vegetables from the following list. Each vegetable quantity is in brackets: Carrots (2), Cauliflower (1), Onion (2), Parsnips (2), Peas (3 pods), Potatoes (2), Runner beans (3 pods), Tomatoes (3). Each vegetable type will be judged out of a total of 20 points. The overall mark will therefore be out of 60.
2. All vegetables are to be displayed for effect and in an area measuring 18"x24" (45 x 60 cm). No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. A tray/board can be used or the area can simply be marked on the staging. Tray internal measurements must not exceed 18" x 24" (45x60 cm).
3. A black cloth and painted tray are permitted. Decorative parsley is allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia or string. Onion rings or sand may be used.
4. The Grindleford Gardener's Tray class prizes are 1<sup>st</sup> £15, 2<sup>nd</sup> £10, 3<sup>rd</sup> £5.
